



MENS' FELLOWSHIP

2019 started in the usual way with our Party which included the members and ladies plus invited guests.

The food was contributed by those attending and what a selection of savoury and desserts! The tables looked as if we had enough for a Harvest Supper but, surprisingly, at the end of the evening there was very little left.

The entertainment was provided by Peter Elliott (sorry that Celia was not able to attend) This consisted of quiz papers on various subjects – name the celebrity pictures and various other **party games**. Great fun was had by all with lots of laughter and the scratching of heads with some of the questions. It was also a delight to welcome Stephen Bates and Tony Clark as new members joining the Fellowship.

A CHALLENGE & AN APPEAL

This year between the 1st January and 31st December I am challenging myself to Run 1000 miles before I am 40. I will be doing weekly runs by myself and also taking part in Local Park Runs on Saturdays. On top of this I will be doing a competitive 10km Run every month.

I have chosen to support Young Epilepsy because I am aware of the daily struggles my niece Tayah, as well as her Mum, Stepdad and Little Brother go through. After years of seizures and more hospital visits than we could count, Tayah is now on a waiting list to have brain surgery. The part of the brain where her epilepsy is, means she will never grow out of it, so surgery for her is the only option, which we are hoping will be within the next 3 months. Tayah like most people with Epilepsy go through so much, things that we can't even imagine. Hospitals to her and her Mum virtually are a second home, most recently Tayah had a 6 hour operation to put 16 probes in to her head, 2 of which she decided to pull out a day later. This is a tiny part of what Tayah and our family go through, all with the help of the outstanding and dedicated work of:- The Amazing Doctors and Nurses at Great Ormond Street Hospital; The Teachers at Heathfield Special School Fareham; Young Epilepsy; and especially for her Mum, Cafe Nero (other coffee shops are available). I could go on and on but I hope you will take a moment to consider Tayah and anyone you might know with Epilepsy and give as much as you can to a fantastic charity.


